
Arrival and Dismissal

Safety is always a #1 concern. Thank you for partnering with us by using the crosswalk in and out of the parking lot, turning right onto Oak Hill as you exit the parking lot in the afternoon, and remaining in your car if you are in the pick-up lane. Please also refrain from using your cell phone during arrival and dismissal. Students may only enter from the passenger side of the car in the pickup lane and may not enter a car until the cars have come to a complete stop. Because we have such a large population of small, young children, we are asking parents to wait by the walking path and keep the entrance clear so that the children and teachers can see everyone. Parkview Car Loop




Student Afternoon Pickup Directions

Dear Parkview Families,

On January 8, 2002, the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) was signed into law. Section 1111 (h)(6)(A) states that as a parent of a student at Parkview Elementary, receiving Title 1 Funds, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers instructing your child. Federal law requires the school division to provide you this information in a timely manner upon request. Specifically, you have the right to request the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grades and subject he or she teaches.
 - All of our Parkview teachers are highly qualified in the areas for which they are the teacher of record.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status because of special circumstances.
 - We have no homeroom teachers in this category.
- The Teacher's college major, whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree
 - We have appropriately certified teachers who have earned their college degrees from various colleges and universities. Our reading teachers are specialists in their field.
- Whether paraprofessionals provide services to your child and if so, their qualifications.
 - We have several instructional paraprofessionals who support our children under direct planning of the classroom teachers. They are all highly qualified for their positions.
