

Advanced Placement

The Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) enables willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies while still in high school. The program consists of college-level courses developed by the AP Program that high schools can choose to offer, and corresponding exams that are administered once a year. Taking AP courses and exams can help students stand out on college applications. AP Courses on a student's transcript shows that they've challenged themselves with the most rigorous courses available to them. Success on an AP Exam shows that students are ready for college-level coursework, earn college credit and/or skip introductory course in college. Most four-year colleges and universities in the United States - as well as many institutions in more than 100 other countries - grant students credit, placement, or both for qualifying AP Exam scores. College Credit Plus

College Credit Plus Courses provides more options for students to pursue rigorous academic coursework beyond the high school classroom. Under College Credit Plus, students can complete their freshman year of college or more, or explore college content that is of interest. College Credit Plus courses may be offered in the high school classroom, and at local colleges. High school credit awarded for courses successfully completed under College Credit Plus will satisfy or exceed the graduation requirements and subject area requirements of the school district.

Tri-County International Baccalaureate Programme

Established in 1968, the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) was the first programme offered by the IB. The programme aims to develop students who have excellent breadth and depth of knowledge – students who flourish physically, intellectually, emotionally and ethically. The Diploma Programme (DP) curriculum is made up of six subject groups and the DP core, comprising theory of knowledge (TOK), creativity, activity, service (CAS) and the extended essay. Through the Diploma Programme (DP) core, students reflect on the nature of knowledge, complete independent research and undertake a project that often involves community service.

Wooster High School has a comprehensive music, arts, and STEM program, offers over 30 clubs and 27 interscholastic sports teams, and has a nationally recognized Speech and Debate program.
