

#### **COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS**

# TRI-COUNTY INTERNATIONAL ACADEMY AND INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE ORGANIZATION

Wooster High School, working collaboratively with the Tri-County Educational Service Center and other local schools, offers the globally recognized International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme. IB is an academically balanced two-year program with final examinations that prepare students in grades 11 and 12 for a successful college and/or university experience. By completing this course of study, students may be awarded scholarships, college credit and advantageous admission consideration to prestigious institutes of higher education.

The IB Diploma Programme is a total program faught at an advanced level, similar to Advanced Placement (AP) courses. The students experience coursework in:

- English
- Second Language (Spanish or German)
- Social Studies (History of the Americas including Government)
- Science (Chemistry and/or Advanced Biology or Physics)
- Math (Algebra II required)
- Theory of Knowledge

Students will also engage in activities that involve creativity, action, service (CAS Project), understanding how learning takes place and extensive research.

Successful completion of this program will result in earning two diplomas: Wooster High School Diploma and the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

### Preschool and Student Services

#### LITTLEST GENERALS PRESCHOOL

The Littlest Generals Preschool program operates six half-day (AM/PM) sessions for three and four year olds. Our 5-Star Step Up To Quality-rated classes are taught by certified teachers who use Ohio's Early Learning and Development standards to provide an engaging and developmentally appropriate curriculum. Emphasis is placed on meeting the individual needs of students, as well as social and academic growth. #### **STUDENT SERVICES**

The Wooster City School District provides an extensive program of special education support and related services along a continuum of settings. Approximately 16 percent of our students are identified as having special needs.

**Special Education:** Teacher-based teams co-plan to co-serve through proactive instructional practices for each student within his or her grade level. Curriculum and instruction is rigorous, culturally responsive and universally designed for all students. Various resource-based methodologies are implemented as strategies to address specific student needs:

- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) techniques bring about meaningful and positive changes in student behavior.
- **Sensory integration techniques** provide the sensory input a student needs to stay focused and organized throughout the day.
- Strength-based instruction and integrated special education and mental health services address the social, emotional and academic learning needs of students.

**Research-based practices** are tailored to enhance the instructional capacities of all staff working with students presenting significant academic, social, emotional and/or behavioral needs.

**Nursing:** Nursing services are available at all of our school buildings. Our model includes an Akron Children's Hospital District Registered Nurse. Each school building is also staffed with either a Registered Nurse or a Medical Assistant.

**Additional Services:** A comprehensive integrated continuum of services including speech language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, audiology, English Language Learner (English as a second language), psychological services and clinical counseling is available for all eligible students. Guidance counselors are available for all K-12 students.


