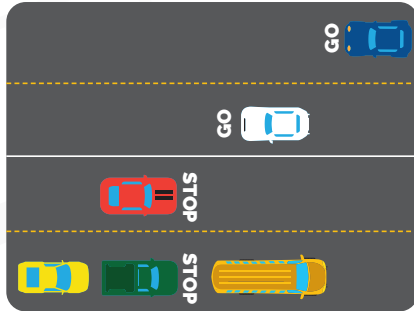
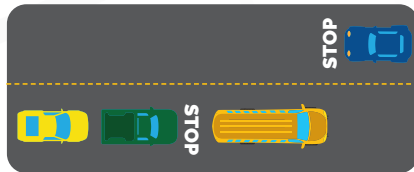


SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK

October 19-23

WHEN TO STOP FOR A SCHOOL BUS:



TWO OR THREE-LANE ROAD

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.

FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY

If a bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, **only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.**

BUS SAFETY TIPS

- **Flashing yellow lights mean the bus is getting ready to stop.** Slow down and be prepared to stop.
- When the bus's **red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, you must come to a complete stop.**
- **Never pass a stopped school bus on the right side** as students may be entering or exiting the bus.
- **Stay back 10 yards or stop short** of the bus 10 yards if you are driving in the opposite direction.
- Young students ***may not remember*** the safety rules.
- Watch for kids gathering at bus stops or walking on the road.
- Watch your speed.
- Obey area school bus laws.
- **EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED!**

BUS CLEANING MEASURES

- **EVERY bus is cleaned, sanitized and disinfected** after students exit.
- Peroxide based fogging vapor is used to sanitize district buses and vans.
- Frequently sanitizing of high-touch surfaces.
