- Moved down to Jupiter, FL to work at Scripps Research under Dr. Matthew D. Disney to assist in the development of therapies and scientific tools that help fight cancer, rare genetic diseases (Huntington's Disease, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), etc.), Alzheimer's Disease and others.
- Recently had his PhD work published in a scientific journal (Nature Chemical Biology) which was featured in the January 2021 issue. He is also working on a new piece on the topic of ALS with Scripps Research.
- Secured a fellowship from the Huntington's Disease Society of America for his new position with Scripps Research.
